Treasurer's Report

Profit & Loss Statement

For the period of 30 June 2025 – 31 May 2026

- Opening bank balance: \$18,438.19
- Closing bank balance: \$12,190.94
- Change in balance: -\$6,247.95
- Please note due to an error, credits in expenses relate to Sponsorship being requested for Nick Staikos as advertising, and subscription in positive as FLC payments were partly added to subscriptions. Balances out, just placed in the wrong areas.

Income

- Bar, food, and social revenue: \$37,100
- The bar, food and social revenue was largely put under one income, so the exact amount made from social events is unclear.
- \$2,000 grant for covers at Dane Road (yet to be purchased).

Cost of Goods Sold

- Bar and food purchases: \$24,0000 (including Thursday night meals)
- Gross profit: \$13,100

Operating Expenses

- Sunday team & umpires.
- Registrations (council & league).
- Match balls.
- Curation costs.
- Other operating/admin: The administration fees included costs such as Xero, Wix Website, etc.
- Total operating expenses: \$51,418.15

Operating Results

- Net surplus/(deficit): -\$6,247.95

Comparative Summary

- Previous year total income: \$102,417.74
- 2025/26 total income: \$88,867.47
- Income decreased approximately 13.3% (\$13.6k)

- This decline in top-line revenue, combined with fixed and semi-fixed costs (registration, curation, umpired), contributed to the deficit.

Key Reasons for Loss

- Sunday team costs with umpires increased and were not offset by subscriptions.
- Council and league registrations remained significant.
- Balls and match consumables continued without subscription income inflows (Sunday team).
- Ground curations costs with limited assistance at times.

Actions to Consider

- Reinstate/adjust player subscriptions or introduce a Sunday-team fee to match umpire and ball costs.
- Review curation schedule and options.
- Improve bar/food/social event cost management.
- Grow social revenue (events & sponsorships) to lift gross profit.

Captains Report – Harrison Bean

Another successful season for the First XI.

Getting out of Division 2 and back into Division 1 was the main goal for the season. To achieve that goal by winning it all was an outstanding achievement and a great effort from everyone involved.

We maintained a top two position for most of the season, despite having a different side almost every single week due to unlucky short and long-term injuries, unavailability's, and suspensions. We had the most in-and-out changes in the whole competition.

Although we kept finding ways to win — sometimes even winning ugly — we always found a way, which was very impressive and showed signs of grit and determination.

In the last few rounds, we lost a couple of close games and player availability slowly caught up to us, finishing 3rd in the regular season.

We were then set the tough task of winning two away games to claim the premiership. In the semi-final against Bonbeach, we had a dominant display, batting the whole day and making 307 from 80 overs, which proved too much for Bonbeach to chase. That gave us great confidence heading into the final against Cheltenham, the side that had our measure a few times this season, beating us with ease.

We were all comfortable being the underdogs and sensed the great, rare opportunity to play in a Grand Final, especially with Division 1 as the ultimate reward. All the boys were very confident and backed our abilities. We batted first and yet again batted all 80 overs, making 269. We were all very happy with that score and headed into the next day with full momentum. We came out very hot and never stopped putting the pressure on Cheltenham — taking wickets, starving the run rate, and never looking back. We ended up bowling them out for 165. An outstanding team effort and reward for all the adversity we faced during the season, where we could have folded and let the season unravel, but instead stuck at it and ended up competing to the best of our abilities.

Onto a few individuals, starting with who else but Dylan Woolley — the best batsman in the competition — finishing with a massive 888-run season across Division 2 and T20s. Dylan's consistency throughout the year was unmatched and completely flawless. Whether we needed him to score quickly or anchor the innings, he read the situations perfectly and executed week in and week out. With the pressure of finals approaching, Dylan wasn't satisfied with just having an amazing season — he wanted a massive finals campaign and to win his second flag with Bayside in his short career. He delivered on

with 123 in the semi-final and 89 in the Grand Final. A truly remarkable season for the 21-year-old. We can't wait to see how he goes in Division 1.

Another two individuals were our future superstars, Owen Bernes and Sanithu Don - two 15-year-olds who found their roles in the First XI and performed every single week to become very important players in our grand final success. Owen, who has the potential to be one of the best all-rounders in whichever level of cricket he desires, finished the season with 200+ runs and 20+ wickets. Sanithu Don, a complete batting talent who will go on to play very high levels of cricket, finished with 360 runs. Both, in their first season playing First XI cricket, excelled, and I'm super pumped to see how they go next season in Division 1.

Lastly, some love for the bowlers — Richie Hunter yet again won another bowling award for Bayside CC First XI. A truly remarkable effort of consistency and longevity, just missing out on leading the league bowling averages. He finished with a ridiculous 38 wickets for the season. At his age, he keeps defying logic, taking a wicket in every single game bar one. Another super impressive season from the GOAT, Richie Hunter.

Seamus McIlroy, a solid role player who has turned himself into a key pillar of our side, led our attack brilliantly. He improves every single season, and this one was his best so far in Bayside colours. He had a dominant season with the ball, finishing third league-wide with 26 wickets. A very impressive season from Seamus, and I'm keen to see him take another leap next season.

Lastly, I just want to thank all the players, coaches, president, committee members, and volunteers throughout the season who made my job as captain as easy as it could be. I love leading the Bayside First XI, and it makes the job even easier with all your continuing support and backing.

Junior Report

Managers. I would also like to thank the Senior players that helped with school cricket sessions and Blast sessions. A special mention goes to Richie Hunter for running most of the Blast sessions, Nigel Barrie for taking high quality photos of the children in their games and arranging the trophies and Paul Sugden, our club president for his unwavering support and guidance.
